Long a Words (page 31)

Materials:

- letter flashcards Aa-Zz
- long a flashcards
- picture cards (train, cake, tray, game, snail, wave, skate, plane, rain and any other long a words with a/silent e, ai or ay)
- word cards (train, cake, tray, game, snail, wave, skate, plane, rain and any other long a
 words with a/silent e, ai or ay)
- string or 3 hula hoops
- page 31

Review: 2-3 minutes

- Mix up the letter flashcards and show them to the students one at a time.
 - Hint: You should develop a routine when doing this.

Teacher: "Letter?" Students: "A."Teacher: "Sound?" Students: "/a/."

- o *Hint:* For older children you can also set a timer to see how long it takes them to get through all the letters saying the letter name and sound. You can record this time and let the students try and get a better time each day.
- You can also choose to play any of the games that have been taught in previous lessons.
 - o Around the World
 - o Flyswatter
 - Beanbag Toss
 - Relay Race
- Just adapt any of the games to help you review the letter names and sounds of the alphabet.

Preview: 5-7 minutes

- Show them the 3 different **long a** flashcards and talk about how each one makes the long a sound.
 - O Discuss how we can make the long a sound by adding a silent e to the end of the word. We can put the letters ai together to make the long a sound. We can also put the letters ay together to make the long a sound. This usually is done if the long a sound is at the end of the word or syllable.

Teacher: "A /a/ /a/
 Students: "A /a/ /a/

- Show them the long a picture cards, emphasizing the long a sound in each word.
 - Teacher: "/a/ /a/ train"; students repeat



Teacher: "/a/ /a/ cake"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ tray"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ game"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ snail"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ wave"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ skate"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ plane"; students repeat
Teacher: "/a/ /a/ rain"; students repeat

Modeling: 7-10 minutes

- Show a picture card and say the word that goes with the picture. Have the students repeat.
 - o Now ask the students what letters they think make the **long a** sound in the word.
 - If they think it is a **silent e**, they should put their finger to their mouth like they are asking someone to be quiet.
 - If they think it is **ai**, they should stand nice and straight and put their hands together, over their heads, like they are making a lowercase i.
 - If they think it is **ay**, they need to keep their legs together and spread their arms apart, like they are making the letter y.
 - Now hold up the word that matches the picture card.
 - Have the students tell you what letters they see in the word that are making the long a sound.
 - The students should check what motion they did and make corrections if necessary.
 - o Once all of the students are doing the correct motion, read the word together.
 - o Continue with as many picture and word cards as is necessary.

Guided Practice: 5-7 minutes

- Play Relay Sort.
 - Make three circles at one end of the room. Label one a/silent e, one ai and one ay.
 - Divide the class into two teams.
 - o Give the first students in each line a picture card with the long a sound.
 - Teacher says go and the students move to the end of the room with the circles and place their picture card in the correct circle. Then they return back to line.
- Continue until all students have placed a card in a circle.
- Hold up each card and have the students tell you if it is in the correct circle and which long a spelling is used in the word.

Independent Practice: 5-7 minutes

- Explain how to do page 31.
 - Hint: Have an extra copy for you to model each part prior to giving it to the students.
- Pass out page 31 to each student.

Assessment: (during Independent Practice)

- As the students are completing page 31, monitor and give guidance/ support/correction/praise, as needed.
- Use page 31 as a record and be sure to take note of students who may need more practice and/or instruction.

Closure: 1-2 minutes

- Show a **long a** word card and read together. Have the students say how the **long a** sound is made in the word.
 - Teacher and students: "/tr//a//n/, train" Students: ai
 - o Teacher and students: "/k//a//k/, cake" Students: silent e
 - Teacher and students: "/tr//a/, tray"
 Students: ay
